Introduction to Drawing Ninth Grade

1.0 Understand and apply visual arts media, techniques, and processes.

- 1.1 Explore and discover a wide variety of drawing techniques and mediums.

- 1.4 Explore the basic skills of drawing: observational drawing, line drawing, value.
- 1.5 Study and demonstrate use of organization and composition in drawing.

- 1.7 Establish drawing as a cognitive activity, become practiced in drawing with the right side of the brain.
- 1.8 Develop ideas and drawing skills through regular practice using a weekly sketchbook.
- 1.9 Learn and apply color in drawing.
- 1.10 Begin exploring environmental observation and drawing.
- 1.11 Experiment with drawing materials in a new and unconventional ways.

2.0 Use knowledge of visual arts structures and functions.

- 2.1 Explore and demonstrate the elements and principles of design in drawing.
- 2.2 Explore the different ways drawing is used in society, both aesthetically and non-aesthetically.
- 2.3 Utilize drawing as a problem-solving tool.

3.0 Choose and evaluate a range of subject matter, symbols, and ideas.

- 3.1 Define drawing and its many uses in past and present art and society.
- 3.2 Research and use past and present drawing subject, symbol, and content.
- 3.3 Use drawing to communicate a specific desired effect.
- 3.4 Form unique ideas and develop them into successful original artwork.

4.0 Understand the visual arts in relation to history and culture.

- 4.1 Research how artists in the past have used drawing for study and finished art forms.
- 4.2 Study the influence of different cultures on current drawing techniques and materials.
- 4.3 Understand past and current use of drawing methods and materials.
- 4.4 Identify and articulate the universal functions of drawing.
- 4.5 Study artworks in relation to historical events and cultural context.

5.0 Reflect upon and assess the characteristics and merits of their own work and the work of others.

- 5.1 Critically and openly discuss and evaluate own and peer artwork.
- 5.2 Evaluate, question, and discuss the artwork of established artists.
- 5.3 Use critique as an ongoing process for aesthetic improvement, refining, and introducing new ideas.
- 5.4 Distinguish between objective and subjective statements and use both when critiquing artwork.

6.0 Make connections between visual arts and other disciplines.

- 6.1 Discuss and experience how drawing is used in many other educational fields, specifically science, engineering, and math.
- 6.2 Explore career opportunities that utilize drawing as a necessary skill.
