Optional Out-Of-Level Testing and Programs for young students

Belin-Blank Exceptional Student Talent Search (BESTS)

An above-level assessment program for students in grades 4-9. A test developed for older children is administered to younger students to provide further information about academic needs. Test sites are available in the greater Des Moines area. Costs vary. There are specific test dates for the Talent Search. A "future BESTS" program, without testing opportunities, is available for grades 2-3.

EXPLORE test (grades 4-6)

A two-hour test is designed for 8th graders and measures academic development in English, mathematics, reading, and science reasoning.

ACT Assessment (grades 7-9)

A three-hour test designed for college-bound high school students that measures academic development in English, mathematics, reading, and science reasoning.

SAT I Assessment (grades 7-9)

A three-hour test designed for college-bound high school students that measures reasoning rather than specific high school curriculum.

These tests provide:

- More specific information on your child's strengths
- Further development of test taking skills
- Access to summer enrichment/ advanced programs through the Belin-Blank Center

Eligible to participate:

Students in grades 2-9 who score at the 95% or above in an ITBS or similar test on Core Total OR Language Total, Maps & Diagrams, Math Computation, Math Concepts, Math Problem Solving, Math Total, Reading, or Science subtests. Students do not have to be in a talented and gifted program to participate. Iowa State University dropped a similar talent identification program that also provided SAT testing. They do provide programs through their Office of Pre-collegiate Programs for Talented and Gifted (OPPTAG). For further information, contact:
