Reminders & Updates

Emergency Drills

Students and staff will participate in emergency drills this month, including bus evacuation, lock down, evacuation and shelter in place. In an emergency situation, we know preparation is important! Please let us know if you have any questions or concerns.

Cellphones and Other Electronic Devices:

If cellphones and/or electronic devices are brought to school, students are responsible for these items. This includes cellphones, watches, ear buds, etc. The school is not responsible for loss or damage to personal items. Electronics should not be used throughout the school day, including during class, lunch, recess, and in restrooms. We want to ensure every student has access to quality instruction with limited distractions. Inappropriate use of electronics may result in a removal.





Student Absences

If your child will be absent, arriving late or needs to leave early due to an appointment or other reasons, please report using Inflnite Campus. The Absence Request tool in the Inflnite Campus Parent Portal allows you to report your student's absence online with just a few clicks. Follow these simple steps:

- Log in to your <u>Inflnite Campus Parent</u> Portal account, either by computer or Parent Portal App on your mobile device.
- 2. Select your child's profile.
- 3. Navigate to the Absence Request section.
- Fill in the required information, including the date and reason for the absence.
- Submit your request.

Important Information from the Nutrition Department

Families will be required to pay \$2.00 for secondary student breakfast, \$3.00 for secondary student lunch and \$.50 for extra milk with cold lunch. This means families need to carry a positive balance in their children's school meal accounts or qualify for free or reduced priced meals when school begins this fall.

If you think you may qualify for Free or Reduced priced meals, you may complete an application. The 2024-2025 online application is available on the District's website. Even if you completed an application for 2023-2024, you will still need to complete one for 2024-2025. Pick-Up & Drop-Off Guidelines

Here is some guidance on how to help make pick-up and drop-off traffic flow smoothly:

- 1. Staff will be on duty at the front of the building from 7:25 7:40 AM for arrivals.
- Staff will be on duty from 2:50 3:00 PM for dismissal.
- 3. Pull your vehicle all the way up behind the car in front of you when in the carpool lane for pick-up & drop-off. If you are first in line, drive past the entrance and stop at the second light pole.
- 4. Parking lot drop-offs are not permitted for safety reasons.


Important Reminders:

100th Street from White Oak Lane to Windsor will be closed for approximately 6 weeks at the start of the year. The intersection of 100th and Windsor is open.

An ordinance with the city of Johnston states that drivers are not allowed to block a crosswalk under any circumstance. When a crosswalk is blocked, Crossing Guards are

not allowed to assist students across the street until the crosswalk is clear. It can also create issues for neighborhood walkers, joggers and cyclists.

Say hello to Xello!

Summit Middle School is excited to roll out Xello this year for our students and families! Xello is an engaging online program that helps students build the skills, knowledge and plans to be future ready. The program uses an investigative, discovery-based learning process. Students better understand themselves, their future career options, and the 21st century skills they'll need to succeed. This program will run through our talented counseling teams, who help students navigate future career choices and exploration.

Be looking for more information coming out in the near future to you and your student!! We wanted to take this opportunity to give you a sneak peek into this program.

Here's how it works...

With Xello, your child will:

- Build Self-knowledge Define their interests, skills, preferences, and aspirations so they can explore
 the opportunities right for them.
- Explore Options Learn about career possibilities and educational pathways by exploring rich, engaging content and lessons.
- Create a Plan Your child can create dynamic actionable plans that outline the steps needed to achieve school, career, and life goals.
- Learn & Reassess Interactive lessons help your child develop age appropriate skills and knowledge for success in school and beyond.

- Access Your Account In the future, you will receive a Welcome to Xello! activation email to the
 address we have on file. Once you click Activate Account through the email, you will be redirected to
 Xello and asked to create a password.
- Explore Xello Family On the welcome screen, you will see all children linked to your account. Clicking a child's name will bring you to their profile.
- 3. Discover Your Child's Interests and Goals In your child's profile, you will be able to see all the work they've done in Xello. If there's no information in a certain section, your child has not yet started or completed the activity. You can explore each section to learn new information about your child.
- 4. Access Your Student Demo Account Try Xello for yourself to get a better understanding of the platform to support your child. On the welcome screen, select your child's grade/school under Your Demo Account. Lessons and assignments are catered by grade and school so if you have multiple children, each demo account might look a little different. Once you're in the demo account, you will be able to take assessments, try a lesson, explore careers, and much more.
- 5. Discuss Your Child's Future Goals and Plan Xello is a great tool to use to start future planning conversations with your child. Try asking them why they liked a certain career. Were they surprised about their top career suggestions? What different pathways can they take to achieve their goals?


Safe and Secure Environment
