

## Johnston Community School District Student Honor Code lowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP)

The following information is to be shared with all students prior to the first day of testing.

We expect all students to complete the test to the best of their ability. Students are expected to follow all teacher directions and guidelines for testing and be respectful of themselves and others before, during and after testing. iPads/personal devices should not be in student possession at any time before, during, or after test administration unless specified by a 504 or IEP.

Prohibited behaviors include but are not limited to the following:

- Causing disruptions or distractions during testing
- Using personal electronics to capture test items or responses (phone, iPad, gaming devices, smartwatches, etc.) Such devices should not be in student possession during testing unless specified by a 504 or IEP.
- Providing help or accepting assistance from other students, which includes copying answers, using prearranged signals to provide answers, sharing used scratch paper, etc.
- Discussing test items or responses with students who have not yet tested
- Retaining scratch paper, sharing test tickets, keeping test tickets or any testing materials after testing has concluded.

Students are expected to bring something to do after testing is completed. The teacher may also choose to provide something for students to quietly work on after testing is complete (i.e. word puzzles, books to read, coloring page, etc.).
