Background Information

- □ The Governor of the State of Iowa recommended that all Iowa schools close for a period of four weeks on March 15, 2020
- JCSD followed the recommendation of the Governor, and is closed through Friday, April 10, 2020
- The most current recommendation by President Donald Trump is that social distancing continue through April 30, 2020. Governor Reynolds aligned with this recommendation and closed schools through April 30, 2020.



Background Information

- The lowa Department of Education (DE) is offering twice-weekly webinar updates for schools
- On Friday, March 27, 2020, the DE provided information for public schools to consider if the recommendation for schools to stay closed continues.
- □ Three Options:
 - Continue as is, with voluntary learning (not required)
 - Move to required learning (required for students)
 - Hybrid approach (some levels having voluntary learning, some having required learning)



Voluntary Learning

- Optional learning for students provided by teachers, with the exception of AP, Concurrent Enrollment, and Credit Recovery
 - AP and Concurrent Enrollment are considered college courses and follow college guidance
 - □ Credit Recovery can continue for those students previously involved in order to not broaden the gap in learning for at-risk learners



Voluntary Learning

- No grades are collected or reported
- Feedback can be provided
- Equity is a consideration, but not a requirement
 - ESL
 - IEP
 - □ Low SES
- Work completed during this time could be considered in a competency based system
- School is considered closed



Required Learning

- Required learning for students provided teachers with a goal of academic rigor
 - Grades are provided and reported to students and families
 - Credit can be earned
- □ Equity is required:
 - ESL
 - IEP
 - Low SES
 - Provision of specially designed instruction and supports for English Language Learners is required



Required Learning

- Expedited application process through the DE
- Work completed during this time could be considered in a competency based system
- School is considered open



Hybrid Approach

- Combines Volunteer and Required Learning Options
 - Can delineate by grade level



Administrative Recommendation

Remain voluntary for the remainder of school closure, or end of the school year, whichever comes first.
